## **MSR Track Report**

Joe Bohannon, Christine Jeffery, Rod Van Koughnet, and baby Kiri were all sad to miss the annual Miata Spring Thing at the Gheen residence, but we were having a Miata weekend of our own down in Texas. Merv Stauffer and the gang at Mount Miata Racing, in Granbury, TX, hosted "Miatas at the Ranch," a two day track event at MotorSport Ranch (www.motorsportranch.com), between Ft. Worth and Granbury, TX.

MotorSport Ranch is a country club with a racetrack, instead of a golf course. They even have a pro shop, which sells high performance automotive stuff. The track is a road course with a number of challenging curves and a limited number of straight sections. Top speed from the NEO Miata contingent was probably around 90mph at the end of the straight before the "Rattle Snake" S-curves, but we were honestly way too busy to glance down at our speedometers very often. There was also a skid pad, where some braking and avoidance maneuvering clinics were held.

The organizers did a first class job, which should be the standard to which all other track events are judged against. 84 Miatas participated, mostly with Texas plates. but there were also participants from California, New Mexico, Oklahoma, Ohio, and Florida. We were all divided into four groups, based on amount of previous track experience, ranging from first-timers, to actual Miata racers. Each day started with drivers' safety meeting and classroom instruction, then each group drove five 20-minute structors so that every car on the

sessions. There were enough instructors so that every car on the track at any given time could have an instructor. We generally started by letting an instructor drive our cars to show us how to properly negotiate the track, and then we took over while the instructor coached us. Once we mastered the track and our instructor deemed us safe, we were given an "OK" sticker, which let us drive solo. The track fee of \$160.00 was a bargain. It included two meals and a T-Shirt. In the two days each driver had about four hours of track time and drove almost 200 miles. We went from 8 to 5 each day and only had some light rain on Saturday morning.

On Sunday, we were treated to a "demonstration Spec-Miata race," which was very exciting. They were truly having a wheel to wheel race, with lots of braking-zone passing and even cars entering the tight S-curves two-abreast.

The organizers estimate a total of 880 laps were driven, or about 15,000 miles. Only one incident caused any damage, where a Miata had a bad spin off the track, breaking off some aftermarket accessories and destroying a set of snow tires. There were plenty of extra tires floating around and they got back on the track within a couple of hours.

Driving home Sunday afternoon, it occurred to me that the weekend on the track was way more safe than driving though Dallas-Ft Worth traffic. The whole thing was super fun and I hope some of our NEO Miata members take the opportunity for themselves this summer with the Oklahoma Alfa Romeo Club, at Hallett Motor Speedway (http:// www.geocities.com/alfarodeo2000/).

Mike Meyer has asked if I could provide some additional information about our ride planned for Saturday, April 29th. First a quick repeat of the basic details. Meet at the McDonalds in Catoosa just north of the intersection of 1-44 and 193rd B. Ave. Breakfast from 7:00-7:45, drivers meeting in the parking lot at 7:50, depart promptly at 8:00 A.M, should it be raining that morning, we will try again the following Saturday, May 6th.

We will leave Tulsa going east on A~l2. We will take the turnpike so that we can drive faster and gain some time. Our first stop will be a "potty stop" at McDonalds in Siloam springs. Then eastward on #412 through Springdale to Huntsville. This is where the fun really begins because it is here that we plunge into the "boonies." We are going to plunge into the best kept recreational secret in America; the Buffalo Valley.

The Buffalo River is the only National River between the Appalachian Mountains and the Rockies. The Buffalo Valley has the tallest waterfall that exists in America between those two mountain ranges. The Buffalo River itself is so beautiful it almost defies description. During certain times of the year the Buffalo Rivers "white water" is so furious it takes lives. But in late spring and during the summer it's almost as calm as the Illinois River. It is a pristine wilderness area with water so clean and pure that you can watch a guarter settle on the bottom in water 12 feet deep. Imagine paddling through gorges and canyons that in places are not 20 feet wide as you look straight up at limestone cliffs towering hundreds of feet above you. I never tire of running this river although it has almost cost me my life on two different occasions.

It is difficult to tell you where we are going because the area is so remote and the communities are so tiny that few of you will have ever heard of them. But here it goes: We will be driving through Kingston, Boxley, Ponca, Jasper, Vendor, Deer, Nail, Swain, Fallsville, Pettigrew, RedStar, Dutton, Brashears, Delaney, Durham, Elkins, and Favetville. We will leave Fayetville heading west on #62 Towards Westvilie, Oklahoma. From Westville we continue on westward through Tahleguah, Wagoner, Coweta, Broken Arrow, and back into Tulsa. At least 250 miles of curves, hills, forests, and great scenery are guaranteed. But the privilege of dicover1ng the location of the Buffalo Valley is worth the trip all by itself. The Buffalo River and its canyons are magnificent and you owe it to yourself to come back again for at least an entire weekend and explore it. If you want to rent a canoe, which is the only way you can really see all of the glorious sights, give me a call. It will give me another excuse to get back on this glorious river.

One word of extreme caution: Do not go sightseeing in your Miata. All of the roads leading down to the river are made of very deep gravel. Gravel so deep that your Miata will hit high center, gravel sometimes as large as your fist. This is primitive country and so are the roads. Fxplore it in a SUV, Jeep or pick-up truck. Do not try these roads with your Miata unless you are just dying to repaint your car. But find a way to go see this valley. It's the kind of raw, wild, untamed beauty that you think you can only see in the Rockies. Bear. mountain lions. bobcats are plentiful. And don't forget, you cannot kill them at any time for any reasons. And yes that does include the snakes as well. There are places on the Buffalo River, in the deep canyons, that there is not a telephone available for miles and miles. God I love the Buffalo Valley.
