Spring Fling 2007 (Salute to Scenic 7): Earl Larkin

It still isn't too late to make your reservations. As of March 21st we had 23 cars going. Simply call 1-888-624-5521 and tell them you want the NEO Miata Club "special rate".

It is time to get serious about your car. Check your engine oil, transmission oil, clutch oil, and your coolant level. Be absolutely certain that your tires are carrying the right amount of air pressure; if their air pressure is too low you will become painfully aware of that fact when your car begins to "wallow"

in the curves. Don't wait until Talimena Drive to discover you are low on brake fluid: "Bummer".

Radios: Buy one or borrow one, but either way, be personally responsible for putting new, fresh batteries in the radio you intend to use. If you have broken down (Mike Vizeur), had a flat (Gene Bedingfield), gotten lost (Jim Basteri), or something else, and you can't call for help, (Bummer.)

Rules Of The Road: Failure to follow these simple rules can cause some real problems.

Always know, be conscious and aware of, where you are in line when we are in line going down the road.

You are responsible for all the club members following you. Realize that if the person directly behind you in line makes a mistake and goes the wrong way, every single car behind him will follow him and instead of one lost car we have 15 lost cars and 30 people and they don't even realize that they are lost. This usually happens when we make a turn onto a different road. So, if you can't see the car behind you, he won't see you make that turn. You must slow down, perhaps even have to stop, but you must not make that turn until you know he has seen you making that turn.

Drive with your "parking lights" on, not your head-lights. This identifies you as a group who are traveling together to the public and to all law officers and it changes the way they view us and respond to us. Do not be offended when your fellow club members remind you to turn them on because we all

forget to do it from time to time. Everybody also helps everybody remember to turn them off at all stops because leaving them on for one and a half hours while you eat lunch kills the battery (Wild Thang 4 years ago).

Notify the drive leader anytime you think we have a problem: accident, mechanical problem, lost driver, whatever. The drive leader must stop the rest of the group, call an ambulance, get club mechanics (Mac Arnett), send someone to catch our lost club members, whatever.

Our radios will frequently be "knocked out" by such things as mountains, weather, distance, weak batteries, etc. It will be necessary for us to "relay" to and for, one another. If someone is trying to tell the drive leader something and the drive leader is not responding, that means the drive leader is not receiving the message for whatever reason. Someone must repeat the message (relay) until the drive leader responds. The reverse is equally true. If the drive leader is asking has everyone made the turn, got through the light, whatever, he won't "pick up the pace" until "someone" tells him over the radio it's all right to proceed. Now pay attention class: when something is said which requires an answer, relay the message until you know the information has been received.

Pike Pass: It really speeds things up when all members have a Pike Pass and we are trying to make the best time possible by traveling on Oklahoma Turnpikes. If you don't have one be absolutely certain that the drive leader realizes that you must stop at every toll gate and pay your fee. Otherwise the drive leader and the rest of the group runs off and leaves you not realizing what they have done.

About the weather: The club doesn't do club drives on snow and ice: the risks are simply too great. But rain is a risk we do take. Our Miatas have a strong top, defrosting, and we slow the pace down to whatever speed is necessary to maintain safe traction. So if it is raining Saturday, April 28th, yes, we are going. We always have the hope and possibility that we will drive out of the rain. However, should the rain turn to damaging hail, remember the most important rule of all: if it begins hailing, all club members shall abandon their Miatas wherever they are, run to the front of the line, and hurl their bodies over, onto, and around the Miata of the group leader to protect it at all costs. Three layers of bodies will be deemed sufficient to meet the requirements of the rule.
