I want to thank Earl and Dorothy for another great spring fling drive. We had a great turn out for this special club overnight drive, 29 Miatas, if I remember correctly. The weather was perfect, roads were fun, the vistas were great and Queen Wilhelmina lodge on the Talimena Drive was terrific. We really hit it right this year the spring green on the trees was near perfect. Thanks again to Earl and I want to express thanks to those who helped by relaying the radio messages and a specially Kudos to the swipes for doing such a get job in keeping this large group together on a long fun drive.

We got a good report on the "Miata's Doin' the Charleston" Drive from Kevin & Devinna. I guess we'll have to do a club drive to Charleston sometime in the future.

Carole and I made a quick drive to Atlanta to see family and missed Mac & Suzanne's

"Ugly John's Car Collection" drive. I hear that it was another fun drive and an interesting collection.

At the May Club Meeting there were questions about ethanol and gasoline. I want to correct some of the information I gave about the BTU content of the two fuels. I got mixed up on the energy per pound and per gallon. So to correct the information and get the record straight,

Ethanol has 76,000 BTU of energy per gallon. Gasoline has 116,000 BTU of energy per gallon.

You need 1.53 gallons of ethanol to equal the energy in 1 gallon of gasoline. Or to put it the other way ethanol has .655 or 2/3's the energy of gasoline.

Using E85 you will get 26% fewer miles per gallon. A car that gets 30mpg on gasoline

will get 22mpg on E85 ethanol.

To work it out in dollars and cents and to be equal to the consumer it goes like this, if a gallon of gasoline cost \$3.00 you should pay \$2.90 a gallon for E10 = gasoline with 10% ethanol, and \$2.13 a gallon for E85 = gasoline with 85% ethanol. That way it will cost you the same in dollars per mile to fuel you vehicle with these different fuels.

I don't know why this information is not readily available through the major news media. I guess we are not expected to figure it out, or to know that the federal government is giving a \$.50 credit to the ethanol suppliers to help make ethanol more price competitive.

I'm sure glad my Miata gets over 30+ mpg at highway++ speeds. See y'all on the curves.
