WAR BONNET TOM JONES

War Bonnet Park Raceway, Mannford, Oklahoma, 1966 – 1970

War Bonnet Raceway was completed in July 1966 by Sports Diversified, Inc, Robert M. Moore, Jr. President. At the time of its building, the race course was 1.1 miles long. It was then expanded to 2.6 miles, the longest permanent road course in the USA. The first major race was the 1967 Grand Prix held in June. War Bonnet was given its name to honor the Indian Heritage of the area.

During its short history, War Bonnet held the Grand Prix Series, sports clubs of America, Nationals, Sprints, motorcycle races, Trans-Am Championship, NASCAR, Formula I International and the first race of the Continental Championship.

Financial hardship plagued the race track and it sold at sheriff's sale in July of 1970 to Creek County Land Development Company. The track of land previously known as War Bonnet Raceway became Lake Country housing area.

You can see War Bonnet Raceway and drive the course at 25 MPH. Drive 1.5 miles north of the traffic light at Mannford, left at the Lake Country sign for 1/3 mile. War Bonnet Raceway is now named Keystone Loop.
