Where: McDonalds at I-44 & 129<sup>th</sup> East Avenue Time: Drivers meeting at 7:45 am, depart 8:00am.

The "pace" for the drive will be "Cool Cruiser Dude." The round-trip total distance to and from Tulsa will be between 280 and 300 miles. The entire drive will never leave northeastern Oklahoma and the route will be entirely different from the 2009 route.

November 12, Friday – "Bracket Racing at TRP" Joe and Sara Bohannon 355-5187

### Date / Time: Friday November 12<sup>th</sup>, 6:00 p.m.

Where: Tulsa Raceway Park (TRP), 3101 North Garnett Road.

**Bracket Racing – How it works!** You will get two or three practice passes on the **one mile straight track**. The type of racing is called Bracket Racing. **Any car can win**. The name of the game is to estimate your speed for the quarter mile in seconds and hundredths of second, i.e. 20.35 means you estimate you will take 20 seconds and 35/100 of a second. This is called your "Dial In" Time. You will determine this time during the practice runs. If a car puts in 23.00 seconds and the other car puts in 24.00 seconds, the slower car will have the go light one second ahead of the faster car. The start is after positioning your car on the grid as directed by the starter. The race is started by Staging Lights. First several yellow and the last is green. If you go early before the green light, you get a red light and are disqualified unless the other car also does. If only one jumps the gun, the other car automatically wins unless the car goes under the estimated time, then the winner is the car closest to the estimated time. If no one jumps the gun, the car closest to the "Dial in" Time, with out going under the estimate, is the winner. If you go under, you are disqualifies assuming the other one hits on the mark or is over. This is why any one can win. The best estimator on what the car can do in the 1/4 mile wins. The goal is to hit on the exact time you "Dial in" which does happen. There are grandstands to watch the races. We will race together as a class but there will also be other car by classes racing so plan to be there for several hours. **Come on out for a fun evening and bring your camera**. We will decide how to set up the brackets that night depending on our turnout. 14 cars have expressed some interest. Some ladies plan to drive also.

**<u>Requirements:</u>** You will be asked to sign a **wavier** to participate. All **car tops** will be up for racing and all drivers will have **helmets** on. No **passengers** during races. Our group will have some helmets and the track does not furnish them. Talk to some of the motorcycle people to borrow one also. There will need to be a **technical inspection** for the car if you plan to race. You will get a sticker for the car after passing. Our cars should not be a problem. You will also need to have an **ID number** on the car. Bring your own or they will put one on the window with a chalk pen along with your "Dial in" time.

<u>Cost:</u> Admission is \$10.00 per person, no fee for parking. If you want to enter the Miata races, there will an additional fee of \$10.00 per driver. Food and drinks are available and no outside food or drinks please.

<u>Directions:</u> Exit 169 at Pine and go east to the first stop light, turn north and enter TRP on your right in around 1 1/2 miles. Those not racing should park in the area outside the fence line to the pits. If you plan to race, enter the west main gate and proceed to the second fence with a toll booth. Tell them you plan to race and pay the \$10 driver fee. Then enter into the pit area and look for other Miata's so we can park together. I plan to be there early in my red 2006. If we have rain the race will be called off. Call me if you are concerned about the weather that evening. If you have questions, call me. My home is 355-5187, office is 744-5696, and my cell is 605-0039. I will have my cell on Friday evening. Hopefully, this will become an annual event for bragging rights. Prizes will be awarded at the Christmas party. Joe M. Bohannon
