THOUGHTS FROM THE V.P.: RICK FORNELL

As our cars get older, some of the drive train parts, that we have ignored for all of these years, may need to be at the least inspected and maybe replaced.

I developed a strange vibration in my car about six months ago. After eliminating the wheels and tires, I looked further at the drive shaft (runs from the back of the transmission to the front of the differential), and at the two half shafts (they attach to the side of the differential and connect to the rear wheels).

I found that I had two problems: The rear universal joint was worn and needed to be replaced. If you consider that I had about 157,000 miles on the car it was time for something to ware out. The drive shaft is an interesting problem because you can't just replace the universal joint. You have to replace the entire drive shaft (at least on the first generation cars). So I had Tulsa Drive Shaft make me a new one. They are located at 6960 E. 11th street, phone 919-836-0111.

The haft shaft can be replaced with a rebuilt unit that I got from O'rielly Auto Parts. After I replaced the driver side, I decided to have someone look at the passenger side half shaft, so I took it to Floyd's Garage at 18339 E. 11th street, 918-437-9634. Floyd dissembled, inspected and reassembled it for \$20.00. Luckily it was Ok.

To say the least, the strange vibration is gone and everything runs like a Miata again. I hope you don't have to go through this but here are two good sources just in case.
