Nov 11, Tuesday, Tulsa "Veterans Day Parade".

We are in the 3rd Division, Unit 10. In the sequence of the parade we will be located behind the Veterans Treatment Court and before the American Red Cross. We will meet behind or south of Fassler Hall at 4th & Elgin. Please park in the parking lot on the west side of Elgin. Start forming no later than 8:30 – 9:00 am. 10:00 am. is the cut off for getting into the area due to street closings, on Elgin Avenue between 5th and 6th Streets, heading north. Approach the area from the south due to the large vehicle traffic flowing in north of 3rd street. Be aware that Highway 75 is closed at the SE loop of the inner dispersal loop.

The parade begins promptly at 11:00 am. We will match up the Vets we are carrying at approximately 10:00am in the parking lot area. We will have a list available to match up the drivers with the riders. This will be done during a drivers meeting. We will also have blue painters tape to attach the veteran's signs to the doors of the cars and American flags to the cars. We should have donuts and snacks available. Coffee may be available at the Red Cross immediately to the east of our parking area. Bring other personal drinks if you want. A folding chair might come in handy to sit outside of the cars.

We will initially form up two wide (parking). We will leave 4th & Elgin, proceeding two-wide until passing the review stand, then, after the review stand, we can spread out to three wide. Please remember to proceed at a slow space after the reviewing stand. If we go too fast it creates large gaps in the parade. This should not be a problem because we are located behind a walking group. As in past years, there is no stopping or saluting at the review stand. No throwing of candy from any vehicles, only those walking can throw candy.

Any Veteran wishing to ride needs to supply: Last rank, full name (as you want it to appear on your name sign), branch of service, and years of service (i.e. 1966-1977). If one veteran rides in a car both doors will have his/her name/sign on the doors. If two veterans ride in a car, each veteran will have his/her name/sign on their respective door. There is a free breakfast at the VFW at 7:00 a.m. and free lunch at American Legion Post #1 at 8th & Peoria after parade. Last year (2013) we had 20 cars in the parade. Coordinating the cars, Veterans, signage etc. is being handled by David Laughrey (primary contact, <u>laughreyco@cox.net</u>). This event requires a good deal of coordination. Bob Schwarz, and Pierre Smith will continue to communicate with those we need assistance from, and will continue to do so in the last days prior to the event.
