Before the Fall Foliage trip began, there were portents that it might not go off without a hitch. First....it was a "dark and stormy morning" when Jim and Connie Morrison arrived at McDonalds, but they did not drive their Miata. Connie had broken both the tibia and fibula in her right leg and could not ride in the Miata, so they drove their SUV. Dorothy Larken could not make the drive with Earl because the husband of her best friend had passed two nights earlier and the friend recruited Dorothy to help her make funeral arrangements.

Earl Larken got the drivers together for a driver's meeting, he went over the "rules of the road" and gave a brief overview of the trip and lined us up so we could leave Tulsa promptly at seven a.m. After getting the cars in line, one of the cars, driven by Lee Kimberlin, had to pull out of line. Turns out the belt to the water pump had broken. Lee got the car home and tried to install a new belt, but with the supercharger, he could not do it quickly. He also told us that there is an MX-5 power retractable hard top in the pipeline.

The vice-president then went on to hold the election of officers....all officers retained their positions for an additional year except for the vice-president. Ric just cannot devote the time needed to do the job for the next year. No one volunteered for that position, we hope someone will step up to fill it.
