The April meeting of the NEO Miata Club was called to order at seven pm, on 4/20/2016, by President, Tom Mattox. After welcoming the folks, Tom passed the microphone around and members introduced themselves and reported a bit about their MX-5s.

John Ream, Club Vice President, had nothing new to report. The Club Secretary made sure that the attendance roster was being passed around. Club Treasurer, Andy Anderson, reported that the club has a balance of \$1,984.98. Alan Doughty, Web Master, had nothing to report, and our Event's Coordinator, Bob Schwarz, was not able to make it to the meeting.

Under New Business, Tom spoke about the Spring Fling Drive that was scheduled for the following Friday. He described the change of plans that had to be made due to a conflict for lunch. These changes meant that the departure time had to be moved up an hour.

He then told us about a "Meet and Brunch", this event would be at Burn Co., on Saturday the 7th of May, at 10:15 AM. Many of the club members voiced support for the BBQ restaurant. George Walker mentioned that the owner is a member of the SCCA (Sports Car Club of America) and a nice person.

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John Ream spoke about the SCCA Solo racing. He explained that this is a race against your own time, and you need not race side by side against another vehicle. So damaging accidents are almost unheard of. You need not have a modified vehicle, your stock Miata does fine. George Walker remarked that most of what makes a good Solo Race is the driver, not modifications of the car.

Ron Coates reported on the new "MX-5 RF" (Retractable Fastback) that will be coming out in the late fall. It will be a "Targa" type top. When the top is up, it looks like a hard top, but then it retracts and leaves the fastback look behind the driver. The best way to see video of the top in action is to do a web search using the terms "MX-5 RF Mazda", that will take you to links that will show you the car in action. It is expected to raise the weight by about 200 lbs, and the price about \$2000 more than the soft top.

Earl Larkin's name was mentioned at the meeting Wednesday night; it seems many members of the club are missing his colorful talks. I know my daughter used to love to come to the meetings JUST to hear Earl describe a drive. Tom Mattox assured the members that Earl and Dorthy have just been very busy lately. They are over the illnesses that had knocked them down earlier in the year. Therefore, we hope to hear Earl give his reports again soon.

Bill Curts gave a small presentation about some of the club lapel pins, the window decals and where to put the window decals.
