11 - VETERAN'S DAY PARADE - DAVID LAUGHREY

A number of you have asked me for the details on the upcoming 2016 Veterans Day Parade. Here is the latest information I have from attending the parade meeting as of this morning. I will make one comment about the overall organization for the parade. There has been a complete change in the leadership for this year's parade. This has led to numerous organizational and informational challenges to say the least. Everyone is doing their best to overcome these problems and have a smooth parade.

So with that said here is what I can tell you at this point:

- 1) Date: Friday November 11, 2015
- 2) Arrival time: between 8:30-9:00 am.
- 3) Gathering place: the parking lot just south of the Fassler Hall Tavern. It is between E. 3rd and 4th Street on S. Elgin Avenue in downtown Tulsa. Tentatively, we are in Division III of the parade, same as last year.
- 4) Car Estimate: I am currently estimating 20 Miata's to participate in the parade.
- 5) Your participation. I need to confirm your participation in the parade with the following information:

At exactly 7 P.M. Tom Mattox called the meeting to order. As President, he passed the microphone around so that members could introduce themselves. No new members or guests were present.

President Mattox reported on the upcoming Fall Drive, and told the members about the picnic that the club had for the 26th Birthday of the club. Officer reports gave their reports. The Treasurer, Andy Anderson, reported a balance of \$1,552.49. Alan Doughty, our webmaster and newsletter officer reported that he is creating a new access page for the club photos, as Google has killed the previous photo app the club has used for years. Bob Schwarz, the event coordinator, had some suggestions for sharing some of the quirks and tricks of our Miatas. He encouraged the club to contribute their knowledge about Miatas, to others. If you think of something that you might know, that others may not be aware of, please tell us. For instance, Wayne Roth showed me how to look at the navigation map in my car with a very wide angle...so that I could see where I was in the state. He explained that if I would remove all the buttons from the display, by clicking on the left one, then I could use the dial to allow me to widen the view. Bob asked some rhetorical questions to encourage discussion about driving our cars without using the clutch. The discussion drifted to using reverse instead of braking.

When a crowd would gather around the car, which was running roughly, the huckster would put this device on the car, and it would immediately run much smoother....but there was a trick to it, the Buick had a bad coil, and the device would compensate for that. What appeared to be a wonder product was just a fraud. Caveat emptor, let the buyer beware!

Tom addressed those who were planning to go on the Hot Springs drive to vote on dinner choices. He also wanted us to know that there is a good homemade ice cream place he might take us to. The President of the club brought up the subject of raising the dues for club membership. The club has had a \$20 fee ever since the foundation of the club, he proposes raising the dues to \$25 per year. There was a lot of discussion on the matter, but it was decided to table the issue until November, when we hope to have a larger group of members in attendance.
