President Tom Mattox called the meeting to order a little after seven P.M. because he wanted to let the folks who were watching the international space station pass over, get back inside the meeting room. Bob Schwarz had noticed that the space station would be directly overhead just a couple minutes before the meeting was due to start.

Tom asked Vice President, Ric Fornell to take the microphone so that some of the newer club members could re-introduce themselves to the club. The rest of the membership then introduced themselves and explained a bit about their cars.

Bob Schwarz had some tidbits of information for the membership. He also brought up that the Membership Directory is out of date, and always seems to become outdated very quickly as new members join. So, he suggested that we send out the whole membership list to ALL the members. Bob also suggested that it would be interesting to have the date of when each member joined the club, to see how long some of us have been with the club. We will need to figure out how much personal information the members are willing to share with the club at large. But it is something to consider.
